Where are donations going?

What is needed?

- Hay Bales (Round and Square)
- Baleage/Haylage
- Corn Silage
- Grain Mix or Pellets for Cattle
- Mineral Supplements
- Fencing Supplies
- Feed tubs/troughs
- Water Troughs
- Basic Animal Supplies
- Trucking (time, truck, and trailer to NC)
- Monetary Donation (trucking costs, fuel, etc.)

When are donations being delivered?

The group will leave in an escorted caravan on Saturday, December 14, departing by 6 a.m. Due to road closures from the hurricane, the trip is expected to take 8 hours with stops.

What do I need to do to donate?

- MUST have form complete and delivered to a county contact listed below.
 - o Includes: contact info, county, items, size/package/type, quantity, trucking needs.
- Items must be delivered to staging area on Thursday 12/12 or Friday 12/13 by 8 p.m.

Where is the staging area?

Marion County Soccer Complex - 415 Fairgrounds Road, Lebanon, KY. The parking lot across the road from the Marion County Extension Office.

Why have a staging location?

Having a staging location will help combine partial loads to fill trucks and trailers and give an easy departure location to begin the trip.

Will my materials, and/or truck and trailer be safe at that location until the group leaves? Marion County Sheriff's department has agreed to assign a night guard to ensure all donations, vehicles, and trailers are safe.

I don't have extra hay after the drought this summer, what can I do?

There are numerous options to donate physical supplies, however, here are a few other options:

- Delivery of materials from out in the county to the staging location.
- Truck and trailer hauling to North Carolina.
- Monetary Donation to assist with trucking costs, fuel, etc.
- Food for those hauling to limit number of stops needed.
